ARTICLE I, Terminology

§ 180-1. Definitions.

The words and phrases used in this chapter shall, for the purposes of this chapter, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by [Article I of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York](#).

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§ 180-2. Village parking areas.

1. Parking Area No. 1 shall be the parking lot located on Monroe Street on the lot bearing Tax Map No. 228.43-1-20.
2. Parking Area No. 2 shall be the parking lot located on West Main Street on the lot bearing Tax Map No. 228.43-1-54.
3. Parking Area No. 3 shall be the parking lot located on Episcopal Avenue adjacent to the United States Post Office.
4. Parking Area No. 4 shall be the parking lot located on the corner of Norton Street and West Main Street.
5. Parking Area No. 5 shall be the parking lot on Episcopal Avenue at St John's Episcopal Church, being parts of Tax Map 228.43-1-8; 228.43-1-12; 228.43-1-13.
6. Parking Area No. 6 shall be the parking lot located in Harry Allen Park, along Allen Drive at the southwest corner of Tax Map No. 228.12-1-15.
7. Parking Area No. 7 shall be the parking lot located adjacent to the Village Historical Museum and behind the Masonic Lodge and connected to Harry Allen Park being parts of Tax Map 228.12-1-16 and 228.12-1-17.
8. Parking Area No. 8 shall be the parking lot located at the northwest corner of lot bearing Tax Map No. 228.08-2-12.1 near the North Main St. bridge.

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ARTICLE II, Speed Regulations

§ 180-3. Maximum speed limits.

1. Thirty miles per hour is hereby established as the maximum speed limit at which vehicles may proceed within Village Limits.
2. Twenty-five miles per hour is hereby established as the maximum speed limit on the following streets:

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ARTICLE III, Parking, Standing and Stopping

§ 180-4. Application of article.

The provisions of this article shall apply except when it is necessary to stop a vehicle to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device.

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§ 180-5. Parallel parking.

Except where angle parking is authorized, every vehicle stopped, standing or parked upon a highway where there are no adjacent curbs shall be so stopped, standing or parked parallel to the edge of the roadway with the vehicle facing with the direction of lawful travel.

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§ 180-6. Prohibited all-night parking.

The all-night parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited on all streets, roads, highways, including rights-of-way within the Village, and in parking lots owned by the Village between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m., except as otherwise stated herein.

1. Along both sides of Harry Allen Drive, prohibited overnight parking begins at 11:00 p.m. and extends through 7:00 a.m.
2. Parking Area No. 5, prohibited overnight parking begins at 9:00 p.m. and extends through 7:00 a.m., except first row as stated below.

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§ 180-7. Permitted all-night parking.

The following parking areas are permitted to have all-night parking:

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§ 180-8. Prohibited anytime parking.

The parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited in the following locations:

| East Street | South | Between the west curb of Church Street and a point 131 feet westerly therefrom |
| East Street | South | Between the east curb of West Main Street and a point 10 feet east of the fire hydrant in front of 19 East Street |
| Episcopal Avenue | North | Between the west curb of West Main Street and a point 300 feet westerly therefrom |
| High Street | East | Entire length |
| Hyde Park | Both | Entire length |

| West Main Street | East | Between the exit of Village Parking Area No. 2 and the east curb of York Street |
| West Main Street | West | Between the north curb of Norton Street and a point 176 feet northerly therefrom |

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§ 180-9. Parking time limits.

1. Between the hours of 7:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m. parking is permitted for a maximum time of four hours on all streets, roads, highways, parking area unless otherwise set forth herein and except Sundays and holidays.
2. Between the hours of 7:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m. parking is permitted for a maximum time period of two hours on the following streets except Sundays and holidays:

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§ 180-10. Park-n-ride.

Parking spaces designated for park-n-ride in the Village are as follows:

| Parking Area | Location |

| Parking Area No. 1 | 4 parking spaces located at northwest corner of said parking area located along the west boundary |
| Parking Area No. 2 | 7 parking spaces located on the west side of said parking area along sidewalk |

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§ 180-11. Vehicle weight limits.

1. Any vehicle with a gross weight over 6,000 pounds is hereby prohibited from parking on any parking lot or parking area owned or leased by the Village.
2. Vehicles with a gross weight over 6,000 pounds shall not be driven upon Hyde Park, Harry Allen Drive and York Street, except fire and emergency vehicles and vehicles directly serving the residences on said streets.
3. Vehicles with a gross weight over 6,000 pounds, except fire and emergency vehicles, shall only be driven upon Paper Mill Street between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

4. Parking of any vehicle with a gross weight over 6,000 pounds shall be permitted in Parking Area No. 4 between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. only.

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§ 180-12. Handicapped parking.

1. The Village of Honeoye Falls hereby designates the Clerk of the Town of Mendon as the issuing agent to issue special vehicle identification parking permits to any resident of New York State who is a severely disabled person as defined in [Subdivision 3 of § 404-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law](#) upon application of such person or persons, parent or guardian.
2. Such permits shall entitle any vehicle displaying such permit to park in any area in the Village of Honeoye Falls which has been designated by such Village or pursuant to the provisions of [§ 1203-c of the Vehicle and Traffic Law](#) as a place for parking for handicapped persons.
3. It shall be a violation for any person to stop or stand or park a vehicle in any area designated as a place for handicapped parking unless the vehicle bears a permit issued under [§ 1203-a](#) or a registration issued under [§ 404-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York](#) and such vehicle is being used for transportation of a severely disabled or handicapped person.
4. Designated handicapped parking spaces in the Village are as follows:

| Parking Area No. 2 | 2 parking spaces located between a point at the northeast corner and extending 20 feet southerly therefrom |
| Parking Area No. 6 | (Harry Allen Drive) 1 parking space located between a point 30 feet south of the northwest corner of parcel bearing Tax Account No. 228.12-1-1 |

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ARTICLE IV, Stop and Yield Intersections

§ 180-13. Stop intersections.

The following intersections are hereby designated as stop intersections:

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§ 180-14. Yield intersections.

The following intersections shall be designated as yield intersections:

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ARTICLE V, Removal and Storage of Vehicles; Penalties

§ 180-15. Authority to impound vehicles

1. When any vehicle is parked or abandoned on any highway or parking area within this Village during a snowstorm, flood, fire or other public emergency which affects that portion of the public highway upon which said vehicle is parked or abandoned, said vehicle may be removed by the Village Department of Public Works or towing company at the request of the Code Enforcement Officer or member of the Village Board.
2. When any vehicle is found unattended on any highway or parking area within this Village where said vehicle constitutes an obstruction to traffic, said vehicle may be removed by the Village Department of Public Works or towing company at the request of the Code Enforcement Officer or member of the Village Board.
3. When any vehicle is parked or abandoned on any highway or parking area within this Village where stopping, standing or parking is prohibited, said vehicle may be removed by the Village Department of Public Works or towing company at the request of the Code Enforcement Officer or member of the Village Board.

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§ 180-16. Notice of removal

The person removing a vehicle under this article shall, without delay, report the removal and the disposition of any vehicle removed, as provided in this article, to the Monroe County Sheriff's Department. The owner or person in charge of the vehicle shall be responsible for redeeming said vehicle at his or her own expense.

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§ 180-17. Storage and charges

After removal of any vehicle, as provided for in this article, the Village may store any vehicle removed by the Village Department of Public Works in a suitable place at the expense of the owner. Such owner or persons in charge of the vehicle may redeem vehicle upon payment to the Village Clerk in an amount to cover all expenses actually and necessarily incurred in effecting such removal and storage. Such removal charges are not to exceed \$50. Such storage charges are not to exceed \$5 per day, or fraction thereof.

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§ 180-18. Penalties for offenses.

1. Any person violating any provision of this chapter shall be fined in an amount as set forth in the following schedule. Each violation occurring within each twenty-four-hour period shall constitute a separate and distinct violation.
2. A parking violation complaint shall be issued for each violation, and the fine thereto shall be paid to the Village Clerk of the Village of Honeoye Falls, in person or by mail. If the fine for such violation is not paid to the Village within 10 days after the date the parking violation complaint is issued, the fine shall be doubled and the violation may be referred to the Village Justice for collection by legal action as prescribed by law. In addition thereto, such person shall be liable to the Village for any expense, loss or damage occasioned by reason of such violation.
3. The schedule of penalties shall be as follows:
 1. Each overtime parking violation: \$15.
 2. Each illegal parking violation other than handicapped parking violation: \$25.
 3. Each illegal parking violation in an area designated for handicapped parking: \$50.

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§ 180-19. When effective; fines

1. This chapter shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York, except those parts, if any, which are subject to approval under [§ 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law](#) and [§ 46 of the Highway Law of the State of New York](#).
2. Any part or parts of this chapter which are subject to approval under [§ 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law](#) and [§ 46 of the Highway Law of the State of New York](#) shall take effect from and after the day on which approval, in writing, is received from both the New York State Traffic Commission and the New York State Department of Public Works.
3. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any provision of this article which is not

a violation of any provision of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 15 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within 18 months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200 or by imprisonment for not more than 45 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within 18 months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

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
